




Mission Statement

NCCC Theatre department offers scholarships to performance and technical theatre students. Scholarships cover 17 hours of books and tuition. NCCC offers classes in acting, stagecraft, theatre appreciation, script analysis, reader's theatre. In addition to courses students have the opportunity to work on 4 main stage shows per year, participate in a newly formed improvisational comedy troupe, reader's theatre production, and student productions. This small but growing program offers students the opportunity to perform, design, and manage productions.

MUSIC

There are two primary choirs at NCCC: the Concert Choir, and the St. Cecilia Community Choir. The NCCC Concert Choir requires an audition for participation, the community choir does not. In addition participation in the community choir is a co-requisite for members of the Concert Choir. Each group performs a variety of choral literature. The Concert Choir plans an off-campus performance trip each spring. Students generally bear most the cost for this trip. Additional opportunities include private lessons in vocal performance and participation in smaller vocal ensembles as needed.

Scholarships covering tuition and book usage are available to students who participate in vocal music. An audition is generally required for scholarship consideration. Auditions are held by appointment. If, however, a senior student earns a superior (I) rating at a regional music festival and can document that fact, he/she will be awarded a tuition and book scholarship without an audition.
